Are you the leader your dog needs?

A canine relationship is exactly that - a relationship. If you'd like to be sure you and your dog are 'in sync', this is the seminar for you. Seeing actual dog-to-dog interactions and dog-to-people interactions, you can experience life the way your dog does and find out how to improve what you are doing.



A good human-dog relationship is based on two key abilities:

1. Being able to 'read' your dog in reaction to other dogs and to other people
2. Being able to 'feel' the energy your dog feels in different situations

These two skills provide you with the ability to be a leader for your dog, helping them succeed in various situations. When you can interpret what is really happening around them, you can build your dog's trust in you, and in the world. Come practice your skills and discover the information you may be missing in understanding dog-to-dog and dog-to-people interactions.

At the seminar we will be introducing dogs to each other and to situations so you can observe and learn what is happening. You will get a chance to experience your dog handling situations from a new perspective and watch other dogs as people apply their 'reading' skills as well as 'energy' skills.

You can choose to bring your dog to the seminar if you want to work with them or you may also attend without your dog. Either way this seminar is valuable – you will see numerous demonstrations of dogs meeting dogs, dogs meeting people and you will have ample opportunity to discuss what you see.

Please note that this seminar is not for aggression problems. If your dog has aggression issues, you will definitely learn how to better manage situations from this seminar, but you will need to attend without your dog. On your registration form we ask participants to indicate what issue or behavior you want to understand better. For example: *my dog has problems meeting strangers... my dog is fearful of other dogs... my dog is shy and fearful.*

This seminar has limited working spots, therefore if you would like a working spot, please include information regarding your dog – *what problems does he have meeting other dogs? What problems does he have meeting people? What concerns do you have when you are around other dogs?* Lillie will pick the dogs she thinks will benefit most from having a working spot **so be specific and register early.** You will be notified as soon as possible if you have been selected for a working spot. There is limited crating space. Dogs selected for working spots will be given priority to crating space.
